Hello fellow Flyfishers,


Welcome to June and warmer weather and water.

TIPS FOR TBFFC - No. 48

Casting Tip for TBFFC: 31

Our last tip introduced a reach cast, one of the most useful techniques to get a drag free drift when fishing mixed currents especially with a dry fly. To extend this cast before the line would tighten and induce drag, move your rod tip vertically up and down in quick strokes as more line is played into the stripping guide. This will allow you to extend your cast and drag free presentation covering more fish holding water.

Tick Talk

Spring is here and the ticks will soon be showing their heads. Here is a good way to get them off you, your children, or your pets. Give it a try.

A School Nurse has written the info below--good enough to share--and it really works!

"I had a pediatrician tell me what she believes is the best way to remove a tick. This is great because it works in those places where it's sometimes difficult to get to with tweezers: between toes, in the middle of a head full of dark hair, etc."

"Apply a glob of liquid soap to a cotton ball. Cover the tick with the soapsoaked cotton ball and swab it for a few seconds (15-20); the tick will come out on its own and be stuck to the cotton ball when you lift it away.


This technique has worked every time I've used it (and that was frequently), and it's much less traumatic for the patient and easier for me."


Also, if you just pull a tick off, their heads sometimes break off and are left under the skin so this is much safer. Be aware also that a tick with a white speck on its back is a Deer Tick; these can cause Tick Fever so check yourself and your family good if you see any of these!


Unless someone is allergic to soap, I can't see that this would be damaging in any way. Please pass on. Everyone needs this helpful hint.

Lloyd Bull

Farewell to Great Bear Lake's legendary laker taker

'M IN A cabin on a Quebec trout lake and Lloyd Bull is telling me a story about the time he meticulously engineered a hunt to drive a buck into the crosshairs of a perfectly situated shooter—only the greenhorn at the trigger fell asleep. "I kept waiting for the shot," said the legendary outdoorsman, his voice rising with incredulity. "No shot!"

Two years later, I still smile at the memory. Whether hunting or fishing, Laker Lloyd Bull always took his shot. And many of those chances took place in Canada's Far North, the American adventurer's spiritual second home. He visited the region frequently, eventually focusing his attention on Great Bear Lake in the N.W.T., mapping its shoals by hand and pioneering the art of catching monster lake trout (hint: big spoons, and loose drags to "let 'em run"). His prowess resulted in two IGFA world records, including a 72-pound goliath he battled to the boat in 1995—a record that stands to this day.

Bull's biggest contribution to northern angling, however, took place after his boat capsized on Great Bear and his native guide perished in the icy chop. He responded by helping craft safety recommendations for the notoriously dangerous lake, calling for better boats and survival equipment, better training of guides and a "buddy system." whereby boats always travel in pairs.

In the end, skin cancer got him, and Bull died this past January at the age of 86. The disease was almost certainly caused by a life spent hunting and fishing in the sun, but I don't think he would have had it any other way. Indeed, as recently as a week before his death, too weak to stand, he was still asking one of his sons to take him out fishing. That was Lloyd Bull. He took his shot.

FLY OF THE MONTH

Beachcomber

As Tied by Layne "Smitty" Smith



Materials:

Hook: Gamakatsu SC 15 size 2 **Thread:** Flatwaxed Nylon to match

Flash: 2 strands of pink Krystal Flash doubled

Body: White Polar Fibre

Wing: Olive or tan Polar Fibre Divided (or your choice

of color)

Throat: Senyo Laser Dub silver minnow and a touch of

Senyo Laser Dub red (folded).

Overwing: Senyo laser dub to match wing

Cement: Locktite Gel (or similar)

Head: Fish Skull (small) color to match pattern

Tying Instructions:

- 1. Base wrap back half of hook and tie in doubled Krystal Flash, fold back and tie down.:
- 2. Tie in white Polar Fibre on top of hook shank. (This fly rides hook point up.)
- 3. Invert fly (or rotate if using a rotary vise) and tie in divided colored Polar Fibre; half on each side of fly. *

 NOTE Wing total (colored Polar Fibre) should be twice the size of belly (white Polar Fibre) amount.
- 4. (A & B): Invert (or rotate) hook and tie in throat. (A) First tie in Senyo Silver dub at then small amount of red. (See photo). (B) Fold back so silver dub veils the red. (See photo). Tie down.
- 5. Invert (or rotate) hook and tie in overwing in middle, fold back and tie down leaving room for skull. Whip finish and cut thread.
- 6. Apply small drop of Locktite to either side of thread wraps and slide on Fish Skull. Re-tie thread.
- 7. Build up thread dam in front of Fish Skull and whip finish.
- 8. Coat thread wraps with head cement.

"What a great time to go fishing!"

I received two reports from our traveling flyfishers John and Joan Willis. On May 8, they also being members of the Trout Unlimited in Georgia, spent the day at the Chatahoochee National Fish Hatchery near Sutches, Georgia with Veterans. John reports being impressed with how helpful and friendly all the vets were with each other. After a hot dog lunch they fished and caught plenty of trout for dinner. On May 9, at the same hatchery along with the same chapter of Trout Unlimited, they assisted about 200 developmentally challenged children fish for trout fish in a special area. These children were allowed to each keep 8 fish and you should have heard the laughter and squeals when a fish was caught. My personal thanks go out to John and Joan for this great report and for being such good representative of fly fishing.

Capt. John Hand fishing the upper part of the Little Manatee River with Lynn Skipper caught bluegill, stump knockers, bass, ladyfish and snook using 3wt and 6wt rods.

Walt Durkin and Ted Hageman fished the lake in Rogers Park in Odessa and caught a dozen to 4 pounds from float tubes. The fly of choice was a black and white gurgler on top.

The Kayak guy's clients have been getting great results with large trout to 20 inches once you battle through the small jacks and ladyfish.

Nova Scotia member **Sam Bower** and friend are catching small mouth bass and from the pictures some of them are good size. Sam also went shad fishing and caught 4 shad.

On May 4th, **Jack Hexter**, fishing at Anclote Island, spent a good part of the morning looking for bait fish. Using the spinning rod he then caught a nice flounder, then picked up his fly rod. The fly rod was very productive. He caught an over-slot redfish on Robert Fischer spoon fly and a trout over 20" on a clouser. At the end of the day he had released 1 snook, 2 over-slot redfish, 3 trout over 20" and 2 flounder, naming a third flounder "dinner".
