Invited Speaker Leigh West

Leigh is a long time member, former president and board member of TBFFC and a member of the Sunshine State Fly Casting Club. West has more than 20 years of fly-fishing experience on Tampa and Sarasota Bay area waters. He enjoys sharing his knowledge of fly-fishing, casting, rigging, and tying with his friends and fellow fly fishers.

Leigh will show a slide presentation of wade fishing strategies. Anyone who has wade fished with Leigh has marveled at his uncanny ability to spot fish in the water, even when the lighting is wrong or the water is too disturbed or murky to glimpse below the surface. He probably can't teach us how to see in the dark, but Leigh will offer lots of insights on how to improve your catching rate when it's just you against the fish!

Featured Fly Tier Layne Smith

Smitty is one of the Bay area's premier fly tiers. He started tying when he was 6 years old and got serious about it in the early 60's. That's when he got involved in a tying clinic run by a crotchety old cuss by the name of Carl Hanson. From that time until Carl's passing they collaborated on many variations of pan fish flies as well as a number of salt water patterns. Since then he has created many successful new patterns including the world's best bluegill fly, the Crystal Beetle (an advanced twist on the foam spider). His friends began calling him "Spiderman" because of the incredible success of that one. Tonight he will be tying the Summer's Tide fly, great for tarpon, redfish, snook or anything around mangroves. Don't miss this great chance to see a master at work.

It' almost spring up north, but closer to summer here in Florida. The water is warming rapidly, so get out while it is in that magic temperature range, between 70 and 80 F.





TIPS FOR TBFFC – No. 56

Casting Tip for TBFFC: 39

DON'T BE A SLACKER

I want to revisit one of the Casting Essentials. You cannot make a good cast without eliminating SLACK. This time of year when our waters are very clear and low, and wind seems ever-present, long casts are often needed. Starting your backcast with the rod tip on the water and a straight line layout of the fly line to the fly is a necessity. Letting line slip through your fingers during the casting stroke will produce slack, destroying the cast. When the rod stops on both the forward and back cast is the time when line can be slipped under tension to increase the amount of line you can carry. In this way false casting will give you more line in the air. Final delivery will occur when the rod stops on the forward stroke and line is released with your line hand. Let the line slip through your line hand fingers and pinch the line when over the target to control accuracy.


How to Catch a Bonefish

Let Go...of doing the same thing and expecting different results (one definition of insanity). Practice...applying lessons learned. Remember...don't move your feet (fish feel it) Strip strike instead of rod tip strike Cast to, not over or short of the school Use the right color fly Don't use cross-eyed flies Be ready--but not "buck fever" eager Forget excuses + ask for feedback Cast low into the wind Don't move rod when stripping line Point your rod at the line when stripping When the guide says fish at "nine o'clock" don't go digital on him Laugh and joke a lot -- it's all for fun Let bonefish run before setting hook (but not in the mangroves) Listen to guide (as in "Listen to me, Gringo") Let the guide borrow your raincoat and share your lunch When guide says "fish 30 feet at twelve o'clock" don't say "where?" Check your knots ... It's easier in casting clinic than in the wind on a rocking boat

FLY OF THE MONTH

Norm Zeigler's Crystal Schminnow

As Tied by Logan Valeri



Materials

Hook: Mustad 34007 Size #4 or Similar Thread: White Flat Waxed Nylon or 3/0 White Thread Eyes: Large Black Monofilament Eyes Body: White or Pearl Crystal Chenille Tail: White Marabou or White Arctic Fox Tail Flash: Pearl Flashabou

Tying Instructions

- 1. Put the hook in the vise hook point down and attach the thread near the bend of the hook shank.
- 2. You want the tail to be about the length of the hook shank or just a bit longer. Tie in the marabou or arctic fox tail towards the bend of the hook and trim the excess.
- 3. Tie in two pieces of flash on each side of the tail, wrapping your thread back so that the flash and the tail are both back at the bend of the shank. Cut the flash so that the flash and the tail are even.
- 4. Strip a very short length of the crystal chenille so that only the bare threads that hold the material in are showing.
- 5. Wrap the threads of the chenille down on the shank with your tying thread right in front of the tail.
- 6. Bring your tying thread towards the eye of the hook. Attach the monofilament eyes onto the shank with figure eight wraps behing the eye of the hook. Leave your thread in between the monofilament eyes and the hook eye.
- 7. Now wrap the crystal chenille forward, making nice spaced turns which lead to a smooth and even body. Wrap the chenille to just in front of the eyes and then tie it off and trim the excess.
- 8. Build up a little thread head, whip finish, and cut the thread. Apply head cement.
