TAKE US TO YOUR LEADER

Many of our fly club members avoid the Florida heat and do some stream fishing for trout. Leader selection can be a complex issue, but fortunately there are knotless packaged tapered leaders available that are very cost effective. For small streams, 7 1/2 ft. is a good length; larger streams a 9 ft. leader will work. They will have an X designation, the larger the number, the finer the tippet or section you tie your fly to. Fly size is a good way to select your tippet. Divide fly size by 3. A size 12 fly will require a 4X tippet, a size 18 fly needs a 6X tippet. Changing flies or breaking off fish will shorten the leader. Carry extra spools of different size tippet material to add when needed.

Boating Tips

1. Carry a distress flag on your vessel, boat or kayak. When flag is displayed there is no doubt that you are in need of assistance.

2. During transit, on water or land, face the V-foot of your pushpole forward. The foot will catch on the first pole holder and eliminate the possibility of the pole sliding of the year of your skiff.

3. When poling a soft bottom twist the push-pole as you lift forward, this will break the suction and allow easier removal.


4. Keep a drift-sock on your vessel. This is a great tool to allow you to slowly drift a flat at the most optimum speed and position.

5. Spray Armor-All on the bunks of your trailer. This will allow your skiff to glide easily on and off the trailer. Use sparingly, a small amount makes a big difference.

6. Place a small yard sprinkler under your trailer and allow it to run a few minutes. This will rinse otherwise hard to reach areas on the trailer.

FLY OF THE MONTH

Hell's Bay Popper

As Tied by John Hand



Recipe:

Hook - Gamakatsu B10S #2 Thread – Tan or Brown Tail – Finnish Raccoon Tan/Gold and Krystal Flash Body – Foam Strip, Tan Underbody – Medium Estaz, Root Beer

Tying Instructions:

1- Tie in Raccoon and a small amount of krystal flash at bend of hook.

2- Position hook point up. Tie in foam strip in front of bend on hook point side from midpoint to bend.

3-Tie in estaz. Wrap thread forward 2/3rds of the hook shank. Wrap estaz forward to thread point and tie off. Clip excess estaz.

4- Bend foam forward leaving a loop of foam that curves against the hook point. Tie in at thread point.

5 - Bend foam back to form a small loop of foam over hook eye. Tie off and whip finish.

6 - Cast on a flat and hold on!

Captain's Corner: Head to docks for fly rod action

What's hot: Lighted docks with good current flow can provide nonstop fly rod action. Trout have been the most consistent species. But redfish, snook, jacks and ladyfish are frequent visitors. They prey on large schools of baitfish and scattered shrimp that take advantage of the plankton that, in turn, are attracted by lights close to the water.

Technique: White flies that match visible baitfish in size and shape will consistently produce. This is a great opportunity to get youngsters and new fly fishers into the action. Northern visitors with 5 or 6 weight fly rods too light for other saltwater species will have a ball watching fish chase and engulf their flies. Seeing fish take a fly is very exciting, especially if it is one you made.

Tactics: Use a canoe, kayak or boat to position yourself within casting range. Quietly anchor or use an electric motor. Night-time temperatures are more comfortable for both you and the fish. Sunscreen can stay at home. Fish quietly and respect dock owners kind enough to leave their lights on.
